	operations for review and approval by the Owner five (5) days prior to any flagging
	operations.
	The Owner shall be responsible for all direct costs in excess of the \$25,000 budget.
	Compensation for direct costs shall be made per the project payment schedule based

upon paid invoices provided by the Contractor.



IF HOT MIX ASPHALT IS NOT AVAILABLE AT TIME OF CONSTRUCTION THE CONTRACTOR SHALL BE REQUIRED TO MAKE AND MAINTAIN A TEMPORARY PATCH PER ENGINEER'S DIRECTION UNTIL THE PERMANENT REPAIR CAN BE MADE.
- ALL SAW CUTS OF EXISTING IMPROVEMENTS SHALL BE FULL DEPTH. ADDITIONAL CUTS INCLUDING DOUBLE CUTTING TO PROTECT EXISTING IMPROVEMENTS SHALL BE MADE AS NEED OR PER DIRECTION OF THE ENGINEER.

- ALL SUBGRADE SHALL BE PROOFROLLED PER INDOT SPECIFICATIONS. FAILED AREAS SHALL BE TREATED TO ACHIEVE PROPER COMPACTION OR UNDERCUT UNTIL SUITABLE MATERIAL IS ENCOUNTERED AND BROUGHT TO GRADE WITH COMPACTED #53 AGGREGATE.

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


